'Are You Seeing Me Now?'

In India, there is no end of gods and goddesses. Jesus is often relegated to the mantlepiece alongside figurines representing other deities. However, we frequently witness how Jesus can sweep aside these confused beliefs and confront people with the truth.

My friend and colleague, Pastor S, coordinates our WhatsApp project, which shares the word of God sent out to over 70,000 people in five languages every day, in both audio and text formats. He also serves as the producer and pastoral voice of our shortwave programs in Tamil and Kannada.

One such testimony comes from a WhatsApp listener in India, who shared:

I was working in the Middle East but lost my job due to Covid-19 and had to return to India. My parents had pledged our land and taken a loan to fund my studies and send me abroad. My father, a farmer, believed I would get a good job and be able to take care of them. Unfortunately, I couldn't work for more than six months in the Middle East.

Tragically, I lost my father due to illness, and now my mother is also sick, and I am unable to pay her medical bills. Because of me, my parents lost their property, and I haven't been able to take care of them. This has affected my mind very badly, and I considered ending my life.

One day, a pastor from a nearby village came to our house to pray for my mother, but I wasn't interested. He said someone from a Christian organization could help my mother. So, I went there seeking support. They invited me to come to a prayer meeting, but I was not sure and didn't want to go.

At that time, they sent me a message on WhatsApp. I started listening, and the word of God truly touched me. It spoke about faith, and to pray in faith. So, I thought, let me try and prayed, 'Lord, if you are a true God, answer me and let me see you.' I went home that night confused not knowing what to do.

After a week, my mother started feeling better and started walking without any medical intervention. She started doing small tasks around home, rising from her bed for the first time in a long time. Then I felt something speak to me, 'Are you seeing me now?' Oh God, He hears me.

God saved both me and my mother. I believe in Jesus. Please pray for my mother, and we will serve the Lord all the days of our life.

Pray with us for Pastor S, his staff, and the complexity of producing and creating our daily broadcasts that reach right across India and beyond.

A Work of Many Hands

Over the past few months, I've spoken at several churches, sharing highlights of Reach Beyond's ministry across the region, including countries like India, Myanmar, Bhutan, Japan, and Korea. A common question I am asked is, 'How does Reach Beyond manage to accomplish so much?' My simple answer is, 'Through the work of many hands.'

It is through the involvement of an extensive network of ministry partners across Asia that we are able to reach thousands of listeners every day. In each country we serve, there are dedicated brothers and sisters in Christ writing programs in their own language, voicing them at the recording facilities we set up in their locations, and then transferring the audio files to Kununurra for broadcast. On top of that, they regularly go on evangelistic trips to remote villages and towns in their countries to share God's Word, engage with listeners, distribute radios and mp3 players, and pray for the communities.

Again, it is a work of many hands. I have the privilege of meeting up with these dedicated teams in Asia from time to time, and I am always encouraged to see their heart for the unreached, even in the midst of opposition.

This work of many hands is making advances for the Kingdom. A couple of months ago, for example, our partners completed distribution of 100 mp3 devices loaded with programs in the Dzongkha language to villagers in a remote area of Bhutan. Meanwhile, our producers in Myanmar initiated the translation and voiceover of the *Fresh* devotional into the Rohingya language, and the first episodes are now airing via shortwave. In India, alongside shortwave programs, our WhatsApp project keeps growing, with over 70,000 people receiving our podcasts every week.

In Japan, the large shortwave listenership base continues to follow Reach Beyond closely. Our partnership with a like-minded radio station based in Seoul is also growing and plays an important role in expanding airtime across the Korean Peninsula with the message of salvation.

It goes without saying that none of the projects are without challenges, especially since some of the countries we serve are openly hostile to the Gospel. But the work goes on. By praying for us or even supporting the projects financially, you too become part of the many hands involved in this ministry.

I don't listen alone, but my whole family also listen.
I turned up the volume so that my neighbours and
my villagers could hear it. In this way, I take this as
