The following story from Anu, a Hindi speaker from India, is just one example of how powerful the use of digital messaging tools such as WhatsApp can be.

'My son and I live in a small apartment, just the two of us. It's been five years since my husband left, and during this time, I've had to navigate life as a single mother.

My little boy is now eight years old and I often reflect on the choices I made. My family warned me not to marry him; they could see things I didn't. I didn't listen, thinking I knew better. It's only now that I truly understand the wisdom in their words.

I don't want to return to my village; the thought of facing everyone there fills me with dread. I can't bear the shame of their judgment, the whispers that would follow me. I feel trapped, but I know I have to keep going—for my son.

He started asking about his dad, and in my attempt to protect him, I told him that his father was working abroad. But as he grew older, I realised I couldn't keep lying to him. Finally, I had to tell him the truth. It was heartbreaking to see him struggle with it. He became withdrawn and even fell ill for a while. That's when our neighbour, noticing our situation, suggested we visit a nearby church. She mentioned they were giving free gifts to children, and I thought it was worth a try.

So, I took my son with me. Watching him sit with other kids, listening to Bible stories and playing games was a joy I hadn't felt in a long time. He seemed to light up and it was a relief to see him smile again. The church leaders were kind and welcoming, and one woman approached me, offering a gift for my son. We started chatting, and from that moment, a beautiful relationship began to blossom.

Through her, I learned about a WhatsApp program the church offers. It's been a lifeline for me, helping me find hope and strength in God.

I don't attend the church services yet, but my son has been going to Sunday school regularly. It's been amazing to witness his transformation. Slowly, he came out of his depression, and I can see the happiness returning to his eyes.


He now says, "I am happy because my heavenly Father will take care of me." Those words fill my heart with so much joy. He has made good friends at church, and I believe they've all helped him heal.
